ERASMUS+ EXCHANGE IN EUROPE





Erasmus+ program participating countries

- All EU member states
- EEA countries: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway
- North Macedonia
- Serbia
- Turkey

Erasmus+ Studies within Europe

- min. 2 and max. 12 months per study phase (BA, MA, PhD), up to 24 months for state examination courses
- Exchange possible through both the main and minor subject
- Guaranteed recognition via the Learning Agreement (legal binding assurance)
- Since 2022, exchanges formally possible from the 1st semester onwards
- Application process through the International Office





Necessary Documents for Erasmus Studies

- Letter of motivation (EN)
- Curriculum vitae (EN)
- Summary of academic achievements (excerpt from WueStudy)
- Proof of language skills
- Evaluation (Letter of Recommendation)

Application Deadline: For the academic year 2026/27, the deadline is January 15, 2026 (approximately 2 months before the start).



Necessary Steps Before Starting Your Erasmus+ Studies

Application via the International Office

=> Selection and allocation of exchange opportunities by the Erasmus departmental coordinators

MoveOn: Entry in the follow-up form

Registration at the partner university

Preperation of the digital learning agreement

Email and submission of further required documents, e.g., certificate of enrollment, sworn statement for top-up, green travel.

Funding approval, possibly a Leave of absence from studies



Erasmus+ Internship within Europe

- Independently organized full-time interships (mandatory or voluntary)
- Funding period: min. 2 to max. 12 months
- Can be combined with a study abroad.
- Guaranteed recognition via the Learning Agreement (legal binding assurance)
- Possibility of a graduate internship
- Application process through the International Office



Necessary Steps Before Starting Your Erasmus+ Internship

Independently organized full-time internship

Clarification of organizational details with the internship provider, faculty coordinator, and possibly the International Office

Application for the Erasmus grant:

Letter of acceptance, registration in MoveOn, certificate of enrollment, insurance declaration, safety briefing, Learning Agreement Before the Mobility.

Preparation of the Grant Agreement

Funding approval, possibly a Leave of absence from studies


Top-Up for students with fewer opportunities, if applicable

Financial support for travel days + Travel expenses per distance


Mobility grant based on country grouping

- Country Group 2: 540,00 € / month
Estonia, Greece, Latvia, Malta, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain,
Czech Republic, Cyprus
- Country Group 3: 540,00 € / month
Bulgaria, Croatia, Lithuania, North Macedonia, Poland, Serbia, Turkey,
Hungary

Top-Ups and Travel expenses



- Top-Up for Students with Fewer Opportunities: 250,00 € / month:
 - First-generation students
 - Students with chronic illnesses
 - Students with a severe disability (GdB) of 20 +
 - Students with children
- Top-Up for Erasmus+ Internship: 150,00 € / month
- Travel expenses:
 - Maximum funding for 2 Travel days via standard travel
 - Maximum funding for 6 Travel days via green travel
 - Travel distance expenses from 28 € (10 – 99 km)

*Travel expenses are calculated based on the aerial distance from Würzburg to the destination

Partnership exchange

- Tuition fee exemption
- Possibility of a full or part time scholarship abroad
- The opportunity to live among different cultures and get to know them, as well as the chance to make new connections.
- Funding opportunities: PROMOS, BAföG for studying abroad, DAAD, Fulbright scholarships, etc.
